

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What's Normal?



I get this question A LOT! And the answer is: everything.

Some weddings are traditional, others are everything but, but most often I see a mix of the two. Here is a short list of a few traditions & trends so you can decide what works best for you and your wedding:

Traditional

 Couples don't see each other before the wedding & all the portraits are done after the ceremony

2. There's an even number of bridesmaids and groomsmen in matching attire 3. Couples leave before the end of the reception

4. All the portraits are done during the cocktail hour - so couples miss it

5. Couples have toasts during dinner & cut the cake immediately after that

Trending

1. First Look - Couples see each other & do portraits before the wedding

2. Uneven number of maids & men, different styles & colors 3. Couples have a special send off (aka sparklers or bubbles)

4. Some or all of the portraits are done before the ceremony so couples can join cocktail hour

5. Reception can go in any order you want & now couples often wait to cut the cake until an hour or two after everyone is done eating dinner







PERSONAL is the new normal. So have your best friend as your Man of Honor, your mom walk you down the aisle, or your husband cut in on the father/ daughter dance. It's your day, you can really do whatever you want!





Portrait (jips

Everyone wants gorgeous portraits on their wedding day, and few people want to take more than an hour to do it. So here are a few tips to help you get what you want in the time you want to do it:

TIP 1

Always plan for portraits to take a little longer than you think. People love to chat at weddings, which can slow things down, along with drink breaks, snacks, or a missing family

member. I have found it is best to allow 2-5 min. PER posed photo if you don't want to feel rushed.

TIP 2

Let your photographer know if you have any props you want to use (i.e. signs, pictures,

sparklers, etc.) so they can think ahead of time of creative and unique ways to use them.

TIP 3

Email a link to any photos you love or want to "copy." Better yet, share your Pinterest board! Most photographers prefer to be creative and create unique pictures but sharing the style you like along with special requests is always a good idea to do in your pre-wedding consultation meetings.

TIP 4

Don't over think it. Photos turn out best if you don't over think every detail and make yourself stressed out or selfconscious throughout the day. Trust the photographer to help you feel relaxed and give you direction so that you look your best in your images. They've done this hundreds of times before and know how to help you laugh and feel confident in front of the camera.

TIP 5

This is YOUR day. Enjoy every moment!! You will remember your feelings & the experience you had while the photos were taken so let your photographer make it AMAZING.

TIP 6

If you want natural looking pictures, try to forget about the photographer. Listen to their instructions, but concentrate on enjoying your photo shoot with your new hubby, family, and best friends. The photo shoot time can be the most enjoyable part of the wedding day because you get to spend it alone with your favorite people. Act natural, laugh, and smile! A good photographer will edit out any bad ones.













TIP 7

Remember that your photos will be around for decades to come, hanging on your walls and at your parents' house. With a great photographer you will get amazing pictures, even if it rains. Every detail (and mishap) makes up your unique story and will bring back those precious memories. Besides, rain is good luck on a wedding day!! :)

Timeline Tips



There are a lot of details that need to be planned and organized for a wedding day to go smoothly. This list cannot take the place of a good wedding coordinator who makes sure every detail is planned but it will help you have more time to relax & enjoy your day.

Before the Ceremony

- Make sure there is lots of natural light in the room where you plan to get ready. (Window light is SO beautiful!)

- If possible, try to have all details together before your photographer arrives. (The dress, jewelry, shoes, bouquet, veil, etc.) Including both wedding bands!



- Remind everyone to try to keep the whole area tidy and free of trash, bags, clothes, etc. This is where a lot of great candid moments will happen and you don't want to spend the time cleaning up.

- Allow more time than you think you need to get ready! It's better to have a little extra time than feel RUSHED! (If planning a First Look, you will have to be dressed about 2 hours before the ceremony.)

- Most importantly be sure to Relax and have FUN!

After the Ceremony

- Family formals do not have to take over 30 min. However, this is only possible if you have a short list of portraits and give it to your photographer ahead of time! (see centerfold of this guide)

- Let your photographer know if any family members may not get along and/or may not want to be grouped with other family members so they can avoid any awkward interactions during family formals. - Bridal party portraits (including those with you and your new hubby) take at least 20 min. Please allow more time if you want to go to multiple locations, have a large party, or want fun and creative photos (they take more time than simply "smiling for the camera").

At the Reception

- If you run out of time and there are posed portraits that your photographer didn't get before, dinnertime is the next best opportunity. I like to give you at least 5-10 min. to eat (since you are served first) and then we can catch everyone before they have a chance to spill anything!

- This is the fun part! Your DJ should work out the timeline with you ahead of time and will run the show. I always touch base with them in case there are any changes or adjustments we need to make and your coordinator can do the same.

Weddings rarely go perfectly or exactly as planned. It's ok! You have a team of pros & we have seen it all so you can trust us to make everything amazing no matter what.

- Know your photographer's overtime policy. I often stay 10-15 min. late and will help your guests organize for your grand exit. And in the rare instance I am not scheduled to be there till the end, I always hug goodbye so you have a chance to ask me to stay!


